

Sarajevo Film Festival (August 11 - 18)



80th Venice International Film Festival (August 30 - September 9)



CALL FOR PROJECTS



This 19th edition of the RCF will take place from 7 to 9 November 2023 in Geneva, Switzerland, as part of the Geneva International Film Festival (GIFF) and is organised by the Swiss Federal Office of

Culture in collaboration with FOCAL. 25 French-language projects (feature films, TV series and immersive works) will be selected and presented in the form of a videopitch to over a hundred film industry professionals from Switzerland,

Belgium, France, Luxembourg, Quebec, Canada and French-speaking Africa.

Deadline for project submissions: August 21, 2023

EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY FUND FOR UKRAINIAN FILMS



wanted to unite forces to launch a dedicated support for Ukrainian filmmakers, to support the

completion of films or the development of new projects, while fostering co-productions.

The eligible projects should be feature-length fiction, documentary or animation projects in development or post-production directed by a Ukrainian filmmaker, intended to be released in theatres. They must be co-produced between a Ukrainian production company and one or more production companies established in the ESFUF contributing countries (Belgium, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Lithuania, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, the United Kingdom).
